Sabae - A Brief Introduction

Located in Japan's Fukui Prefecture, Sabae is a small city with a population of less than 70,000. It is highly renowned for being a city with strong local industries; known as the 'eyeglasses city', Sabae boasts 95% of glasses frames produced in Japan. Sabae has been involved with the SDGs since their induction in 2015; Sabae participated in the UN's One Woman Campaign in 2015 and established the Sustainable Development Regional Model Division within its city hall in 2016.

Sabae fused its signature eyeglasses with the SDGs mark to make the **Glocal Emblem**. The 17 colors of the SDGs have been placed into two round glasses frames with SDGs goal 5, gender equality, being the bridge between all of the goals, signifying that without gender equality the SDGs cannot be completed. The Glocal Emblem has become synonymous with the city of Sabae; its eyecatching design and strong message has been well received both within Japan and internationally.
